

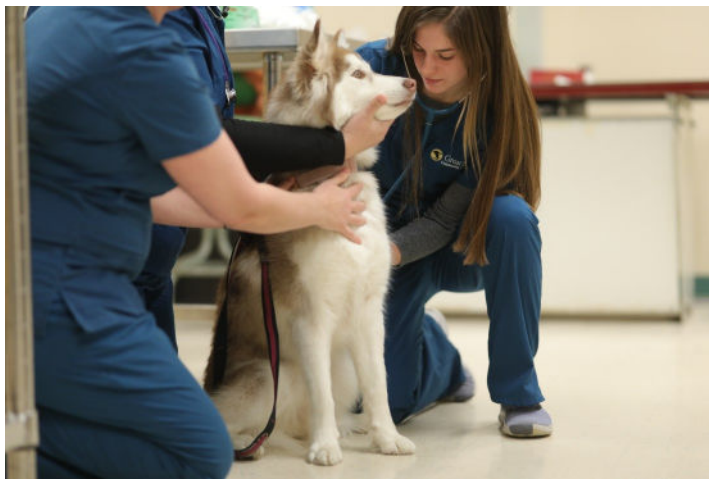
VETERINARY TECHNOLOGY

Veterinary Technicians work as a team with veterinarians, providing medical and surgical care for animals and offer comprehensive support to clients as well as general healthcare to the animal patient.

The Veterinary Technology program is accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA). Hands-on experience is obtained during clinical affiliations at local animal hospitals and spay/neuter clinics.

Great Bay's Vet Tech program helps create skilled medical professionals qualified for employment in many areas of the veterinary healthcare field. Successful completion of this degree program provides students the opportunity to seek employment in veterinary hospitals, medical laboratories, pet-related industries, zoos, research facilities, and the pharmaceutical industry. Graduates are eligible to take the Veterinary Technician National Exam (VTNE) to become certified or licensed.



Veterinary Technology Admissions Requirements:

The Application process, including the interview with the director, must be **COMPLETED** by **April 30th** to be considered for the Fall class.

1. Complete application to the program.
2. Provide proof of high school completion or equivalent.
3. Provide proof of completion of high school algebra, biology and chemistry or equivalent of current enrollment.
4. Place into college level Math, Reading and Writing or demonstrate equivalent competencies through a college transcript or SAT scores.
5. Complete a personal interview with the program director. Applicants will be contacted by Admissions to set up interviews with the program director once the first four requirements have been met.
